# SUPERIOR COURT OF CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF SONOMA

PETITION/APPLICATION FOR RESENTENCING or DISMISSAL FOR REDUCTION or DISMISSAL/SEALING Health & Safety Code §11361.8

## Information and Instructions

### **General Information:**

Under Health & Safety Code § 11361.8, a person currently serving a sentence, or who has completed a sentence for a conviction of a violation of sections 11357, 11358, 11359, and 11360 of the Health & Safety Code may be eligible to have the conviction reduced or redesignated as a misdemeanor or an infraction and resentenced, or dismissed as applicable.

## Am I eligible?

If you were 18 years of age or over when charged with one or more of the violations listed above, you may be eligible to complete the Petition/Application for Resentencing or Dismissal, for Reduction or Dismissal/Sealing form and file it with the Superior Court of California, County of Sonoma Criminal Division located at 600 Administration Drive, Room 105-J, Santa Rosa, CA 95403. Only one petition/application form should be completed per case.

If you were <u>under 18 years of age</u> when charged with one or more of the violations listed above, to obtain a petition for reduction or resentencing contact the Juvenile Division located at 7425 Los Guilicos Road, Santa Rosa CA 95409, (707) 521-6700, or download the petition and order from the court's website. Additionally the forms can be obtained at the Public Defender's Office or Juvenile Probation. For infraction violations, contact the Traffic Division at 600 Administration Drive, Room 109-J, Santa Rosa, CA 95403.

Only petitions where the petitioner was convicted in or placed on probation in Sonoma County will be heard. If you were convicted in another jurisdiction or are/were on probation in another jurisdiction, you must file in that jurisdiction.

#### How do I know which section of the form to fill out?

(The definitions below are intended to provide general information and do not attempt to provide legal advice about how to submit your petition/application.)

If you have been convicted of one of the eligible violations	then
and are currently serving a sentence, under supervision (probation, parole, post-release community supervision (PRCS), mandatory supervision) or are currently in custody,	for purposes of this form, you may select <b>box 2A</b> and mark the applicable box(es) to indicate the action(s) to be taken on your sentence(s).
and have completed your sentence, are no longer under supervision (probation, parole, post-release community supervision (PRCS), mandatory supervision) or in custody,	for purposes of this form, you may select <b>box 2B</b> and mark the applicable box(es) to indicate the action(s) to be taken on your conviction(s).
and are currently diverted pursuant to Penal Code section 1000,	for purposes of this form, you may select <b>box 2A</b> and mark the applicable box(es) to indicate the action(s) to be taken.

## Where will the petition/application be heard?

If the petitioner is currently serving a sentence on the violation or has been diverted pursuant to Penal Code section 1000, a hearing will be scheduled at the Hall of Justice.

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If the petitioner <u>is currently in a collaborative court program</u> on the violation, a hearing will be scheduled in the appropriate collaborative court courtroom at the Hall of Justice.

If the applicant <u>has completed his/her</u> sentence on the violation, the matter will be reviewed by a judge without a formal hearing and the petitioner will be notified of the order by mail.

If you were <u>under 18 years of age</u> when charged, contact the Juvenile Division at the Juvenile Justice Center.

# How long does this process take?

The petition/application process may take between 90-120 days, or longer, depending on the details of the case and the amount of petitions received by the court.

This information document is for general use and not intended as full and comprehensive instruction governing the laws and rules relating to petitions or applications filed under Health & Safety Code section 11361.8 nor does this information sheet attempt to legally define sentence term phrases. For further information you may refer to Health & Safety Code section 11361.8 or you may wish to seek legal assistance.

NOTE: Clerks cannot advise or give assistance in the completion of this petition.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1.a. **For Adults:** Complete the *Petition/Application for Resentencing or Dismissal, for Reduction or Dismissal/Sealing.*
- 1.b. **For Minors:** Complete the *Petition/Application for Resentencing or for Reduction or Dismissal of Sentence/Sealing.*
- 2. Mail or personally deliver a copy of the petition/application to the Sonoma County Office of the District Attorney or other prosecuting agency.
  - a. If mailed, the person performing the mailing must complete the Proof of Service (see page 3 of the Petition/Application).
  - b. If hand delivered, the District Attorney may acknowledge its receipt by stamping the original petition to be delivered to the court.
- 3. File the original petition/application with the Criminal Division.
  - a. Include the completed *Proof of Service*, if prosecutor was notified by mail.

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
