GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the September 28, 2020 Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the September 28, 2020 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Sonoma County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, from September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive, are deemed holidays because the emergency conditions described in the Order have substantially interfered with the public's ability to file papers in a court facility on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4));
- 2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 334, 631, 632, 637, and 657, from September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive, are deemed holidays because the emergency conditions described in the Order prevent the Court from conducting proceedings and accepting filings on those dates as necessary to satisfy these deadlines (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- With the concurrence of the Presiding Judge, the Court may order that sessions be 3. held anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(1));
- Any judge of the Court may extend by not more than five days the duration of any 4. temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive, because the emergency condition described in the Order prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7));
 - In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 5.

28

September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)); and

6. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from September 29, 2020, to September 30, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10)).

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
