Sonoma Water Response Emergency Water Shortages in Sonoma Valley

Required Response to Findings

F5. The decision to close the water treatment plant at Sonoma Developmental Center impacted performance under the mutual aid agreement between the Valley of the Moon Water District and Sonoma Developmental Center.

Sonoma Water disagrees wholly or partially with this finding. Sonoma Water has no authority or control over the water treatment plant at the Sonoma Developmental Center (SDC) and, therefore, did not make a decision to close the water treatment plant. Sonoma Water is not a party to any mutual aid agreement between Valley of the Moon Water District and SDC and, therefore, cannot provide a response regarding the performance of that agreement.

Required Response to Recommendations

R4. Sonoma Water, the Valley of the Moon Water District, the City of Sonoma and Permit Sonoma work with California Department of General Services to seek an agreement, by October 31, 2020, that potable water storage facilities at Sonoma Developmental Center shall remain active and available for sharing water (F5)

This recommendation requires further analysis.

Sonoma Water strongly supports regional water supply resource planning and has been spearheading such efforts for many years. As noted in the Grand Jury's report, Sonoma Water is leading the development of a Regional Water Supply Resiliency Study. Sonoma Water is coordinating with its water contractors (including Valley of the Moon Water District and the City of Sonoma) to conduct the study. The study will include the development of a decision support framework model that will consider regional and local water supply sources and infrastructure. This tool will enable the simulation of emergency water supply shortages to assess impacts to service in addition to evaluating potential mitigation projects to reduce the risk of such shortages. The study will identify potential opportunities to coordinate water supply operations and share water resources with and among the water contractors as part of disaster response. Sonoma Water Response Sonoma Valley Regional Water Resources

Required Response to Findings

F2. The Sonoma Developmental Center has chosen to purchase water from Sonoma Water, rather than continue treating local water for its supply, but the Restructured Agreement may give the Valley of the Moon Water District the right to replace Sonoma Water as the water supplier for the Sonoma Developmental Center.

Sonoma Water disagrees partially with this finding.

Sonoma Water and the State of California have had a municipal water service agreement for the Sonoma Developmental Center (SDC) in place since 1964. This agreement remains in effect.

The 2006 Restructured Agreement for Water Supply includes a provision that would require Sonoma Water to obtain consent from a Water Contractor for any <u>new</u> agreement to furnish water to areas within two miles of the corporate territory of a Water Contractor. This provision does not impact pre-existing agreements, like the municipal water service agreement for SDC, that pre-date the Restructured Agreement.
