Court Ordered Therapy Report

California Code, Family Code – FAM § 3190

Suppose the Family Court determines that there is a significant risk to a child's best interests and that

therapeutic treatment would also benefit the child, makes the appropriate finding and specified reasons.

In that case, the Court may require parents or any other party involved in a custody or visitation dispute,

and the minor child, to participate in outpatient counseling with a licensed mental health professional.

The Court considers any therapist providing therapy because the Court ordered therapeutic intervention a

Court-Ordered Therapist. The Court expects Court-Ordered Therapists to provide the Court with requested information consistent with Cal. Civ. Code § 56.11

In general, the Court must be informed of the level of compliance with its orders displayed by those

ordered to obtain therapeutic intervention and of the likely effectiveness of the therapeutic intervention in

lessening or diminishing the identified risk factors determined by the Court to be detrimental to the best

interest of the minors.

The Court occasionally requires additional information via a Tier II referral to Family Court Services. In

that case, a Court-connected Child Custody Recommending Counsellor will request the information

directly from the mental health professional.

The FL 097 Therapeutic Report Form is designed as a option to streamline the communication process formental health professionals. The form is not mandatory and mental health professional can choose to submit a report to the court or request a consultation with Family Court Services.
