R4. Countywide public information campaign on pet licensing (launch by July 1, 2026; BOS/DHS to lead).

Report text (summary): DHS to launch a countywide campaign, in cooperation with cities, explaining the legal imperative and benefits of licensing. (Addresses F7–F9.)

City of Sonoma response: Will be implemented (in partnership). The City will amplify the County's campaign locally by: posting licensing/rabies info on City channels; issuing renewal reminders; and cross-linking to SCAS/Pets Lifeline resources. **Timeline:** Begin local amplification upon County campaign launch, **no later than July 1, 2026.**

R5. Cities contracting with NBAS to inspect/evaluate shelter and services for compliance (due Nov 1, 2025).

Report text (summary): Contracting cities must inspect/evaluate NBAS's shelter condition and operations for compliance with legal mandates and contract terms. (Addresses F2, F11–F12.)

City of Sonoma response: Not applicable to Sonoma (does not contract with NBAS). The City of Sonoma's model is Sonoma Police Department (animal control/licensing) with shelter care by SCAS and Pets Lifeline; therefore, R5's NBAS inspection requirement does not apply. Nonetheless, the City will continue ongoing oversight of its service providers through existing agreements and performance reviews.
