1. Limited Conservatorship of Zachery M. Nezakati
SPR 097199
Appointment of Limited Conservator

Tentative Ruling: Absent objections, the petition for appointment of limited conservator of the person is approved with the powers pursuant to PrC§ 2351.5(b) (1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) and (7).

The request for medical powers pursuant to PrC§2355 are denied as the Court approved medical powers pursuant to PrC§ 2351.5(b) (5).

The matter is set on Thursday June 1, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. in Department 23 for review of compliance with the Probate Code sections listed below:

-Probate Code § 1830 Notice of Conservatee's Rights (Judicial Council Form GC-341) and a copy of the *Order Appointing Conservator* shall be mailed on or before the 30th day following the filing date of the *Order Appointing Conservator*.

-Probate Code § 2352.5 Determination of Conservatee's Appropriate Level of Care (Judicial Council Form GC-355) shall be filed with the court within 60 days of the date of the court's order appointing conservator.

If the limited co-conservators comply with all requirements above, no appearance shall be required, and a date for the annual review and report of the court investigator shall be set on the LPS calendar for one year after the establishment of the limited conservatorship.

2. Limited Conservatorship of James S. Rebbe

Appointment of Limited Conservator

Tentative Ruling: Continued to March 1, 2023, at 1:30 p.m., in Department 23, for Petitioner to cure the deficiencies identified in the CI memo filed on January 20, 2023.

3. Limited Conservatorship of Hannah Brauner

Appointment of Temporary Limited Conservator

Tentative Ruling: The petition for appointment of a temporary limited conservator of the person is denied.

The Court is aware that objections have been filed, which it will consider for the hearing scheduled on March 8,2023.

Pursuant to Sonoma County Local Rule 6.2 F2, in the event of any contest or objection to any petition the parties or his or her respective attorneys shall make a reasonable and good faith attempt to informally resolve the controversy at a face-to-face conference, (which is deemed to include video platforms such as Zoom), if possible, otherwise by telephone conference, before any hearing of the contested petition. If such resolution is not possible, then each party shall file a Statement of Issues, at least seven court days before the hearing.

The parties are referred to Sonoma County Local Rule 6.2 F3 re the filing of a Statement of Issues or Settlement.
